Plugin Overview

WP AutoFlow is a powerful no-code workflow automation plugin for WordPress that enables you to create complex automation workflows without writing any code. Connect triggers, conditions, and actions to automate your business processes.

Key Features

- **Workflow Builder** Intuitive form-based interface for creating workflows
- WooCommerce Integration Automate order processing, inventory, and customer management
- **Form Plugin Support** Works with Gravity Forms, WPForms, Contact Form 7, and Fluent Forms
- **Slack Integration** Send notifications and updates directly to Slack channels
- **Google Sheets Integration** Automatically sync data to Google Sheets
- **GoHighLevel Integration** Connect with GoHighLevel CRM for advanced automation
- **Webhook Support** Trigger external APIs and services via webhooks
- **Twilio SMS** Send SMS notifications via Twilio
- **Conditional Logic** Advanced if/then conditions for workflow branching
- Background Processing Run workflows asynchronously without blocking your site
- **Activity Logs** Track all workflow executions with detailed logs
- **Template Library** 20+ pre-built workflow templates to get started quickly

Prerequisites

Important: Ensure your WordPress site meets these requirements before installation.

System Requirements

- WordPress: Version 6.0 or higher
- PHP: Version 8.0 or higher (PHP 8.1+ recommended)
- MySQL: Version 5.6 or higher (MySQL 8.0+ recommended)
- **Memory Limit:** 128MB or higher (256MB recommended)

Optional Requirements

- WooCommerce: Version 5.0+ (for WooCommerce triggers/actions)
- **Form Plugins:** Gravity Forms, WPForms, Contact Form 7, or Fluent Forms (for form triggers)

Installation Steps

Step 1: Download the Plugin

After purchasing the plugin, you'll receive a ZIP file named:

wp-autoflow-v1.0.0.zip

The ZIP file contains the complete plugin ready for installation.

Step 2: Upload to WordPress

Method A: WordPress Admin Dashboard (Recommended)

- 1. Log in to your WordPress admin dashboard
- 2. Navigate to **Plugins** → **Add New**
- 3. Click "Upload Plugin" button at the top
- 4. Click "Choose File" and select the downloaded ZIP file
- 5. Click "Install Now"

- 6. Wait for installation to complete
- 7. Click "Activate Plugin" after installation

Method B: FTP Upload

- 1. Extract the ZIP file on your computer
- 2. Connect to your server via FTP/SFTP
- 3. Upload the extracted **wp-autoflow** folder to **/wp-content/plugins/**
- 4. Go to WordPress admin dashboard → **Plugins**
- 5. Find "WP AutoFlow" and click "Activate"

Step 3: Verify Installation

Success! The plugin should now appear in your WordPress admin menu:

WP AutoFlow → Workflows

You should see the following menu items:

- Workflows
- Add Workflows
- Templates
- Settings
- Logs

License Activation

Step 1: Access License Settings

After activating the plugin, you'll be prompted to activate your license:

- 1. Go to **WP AutoFlow** → **Settings**
- 2. Navigate to the "License" tab
- 3. Enter your license key (format: **RS-AUTOFLOW-XXXXXXXXX**)
- 4. Click "Activate License"

Step 2: License Key Information

Where to Find Your License Key:

- Check your purchase confirmation email
- Look for the license key in the email subject or body
- Format: RS-AUTOFLOW-XXXXXXXXX

Step 3: Verify Activation

☑ Activation Successful!

Once activated, you'll see:

- License status: Active
- License tier: Single Site / Growth Pack / Agency Pack
- Expiration date: 1 year from activation

Configuration Guide

Step 1: Access Settings

- 1. Go to **WP AutoFlow** → **Settings**
- 2. You'll see tabs for different integrations

Step 2: Configure Integrations

Available Integrations:

• Slack: Enable and add webhook URL

• Google Sheets: Enable and add API key

• Twilio: Enable and add Account SID and Auth Token

• GoHighLevel: Enable and add API Key and Location ID

Note: Only enable integrations you plan to use. Each integration can be enabled/disabled independently.

Step 3: Integration Setup Details

Slack Integration

To set up Slack:

- 1. Go to Slack API
- 2. Create a new app or use existing one
- 3. Enable Incoming Webhooks
- 4. Create a webhook URL for your channel
- 5. Copy the webhook URL
- 6. Paste it in WP AutoFlow → Settings → Slack

Google Sheets Integration

To set up Google Sheets:

- 1. Go to Google Cloud Console
- 2. Create a new project or select existing
- 3. Enable Google Sheets API
- 4. Create credentials (API Key)
- 5. Copy the API key
- 6. Paste it in WP AutoFlow → Settings → Google Sheets

Twilio Integration

To set up Twilio:

- 1. Sign up at Twilio
- 2. Get your Account SID and Auth Token from dashboard
- 3. Enter both in WP AutoFlow → Settings → Twilio

GoHighLevel Integration

To set up GoHighLevel:

- 1. Log in to your GoHighLevel account
- 2. Go to Settings \rightarrow Integrations \rightarrow API
- 3. Generate an API key
- 4. Get your Location ID from the URL or settings
- 5. Enter both in WP AutoFlow → Settings → GoHighLevel

Creating Your First Workflow

Step 1: Access Workflow Builder

- 1. Go to WP AutoFlow → Add Workflows
- 2. You'll see the workflow builder form interface

Step 2: Choose a Template (Optional)

For beginners, we recommend starting with a template:

- 1. Go to **WP AutoFlow** → **Templates**
- 2. Browse through 20+ pre-built templates
- 3. Click "Install" on a template you like
- 4. The template will be imported and ready to customize

Step 3: Create a Workflow from Scratch

Basic Workflow Structure:

- 1. **Set Workflow Name:** Enter a descriptive name in the "Workflow Name" field
- 2. **Enable Workflow:** Check the "Enable this workflow" checkbox if you want it active
- 3. **Choose Trigger Source:** Select from the dropdown (WordPress, WooCommerce, Form, Scheduled, or Webhook)
- 4. **Configure Trigger Event:** Enter the event type (e.g., "post.published", "order.created")
- 5. **Select Action Type:** Choose from the action dropdown (Send Email, Slack Message, Webhook, etc.)
- 6. **Configure Action Settings:** Fill in the required fields for your selected action (these appear dynamically based on your selection)
- 7. Save Workflow: Click "Save Workflow" button

Note: The workflow builder uses a form-based interface where you configure triggers and actions using dropdown menus and input fields.

Step 4: Example Workflow

Example: Send Slack Notification on New Order

1. **Trigger:** WooCommerce → New Order

Condition: Order Total > \$100
 Action: Slack → Send Message

4. **Message:** "New order received: {order_number} for \${order_total}"

Setting Up Integrations

Integration Requirements

▲ **Important:** Before using an integration in a workflow, you must:

- 1. Enable the integration in **WP AutoFlow** → **Settings**
- 2. Configure the required credentials (API keys, webhooks, etc.)
- 3. Test the integration to ensure it's working

WordPress Native:

- Create User
- Create Post

- Send Email
- Add Coupon

WooCommerce:

- New Order
- · Order Status Changed
- Product Purchased

Form Plugins:

- Gravity Forms Submission
- WPForms Submission
- Contact Form 7 Submission
- Fluent Forms Submission

External Services:

- Slack (Webhook)
- Google Sheets (API)
- Twilio (SMS)
- GoHighLevel (CRM)
- Custom Webhooks

Troubleshooting

Common Issues & Solutions

Workflow Not Running

Possible Causes:

- · Workflow is disabled
- Trigger conditions not met
- Integration not enabled or configured

License expired or invalid

Solution: Check workflow status, verify trigger settings, and ensure integrations are properly configured

Integration Not Working

Possible Causes:

- Integration not enabled in Settings
- Invalid API key or credentials
- Missing required configuration

Solution: Go to Settings, enable the integration, and verify all credentials are correct

License Activation Failed

Possible Causes:

- Invalid license key format
- License already activated on maximum domains
- License expired
- Network connectivity issues

Solution: Verify license key format, check activation limits, and ensure your site can connect to the license server

Activity Logs

Check workflow execution logs for debugging:

1. Go to **WP AutoFlow** → **Logs**

- 2. View all workflow executions
- 3. Check for errors or failed actions
- 4. Review execution details and timestamps
